What is a Speech-Language Pathologist (SLP)?

Speech-Language Pathologists assess and treat infants, children, and adults with speech, language, cognitive and/or swallowing disorders.

Who do they work with?

The following are examples of some diseases/disorders which can result in speech, language, cognitive and/or swallowing disorders:

Stuttering, Cluttering, Aphasia, Dementia, Alzheimer's Disease, Parkinson's Disease, Huntington's Disease, ALS, MS, Stroke, Traumatic Brain Injury, Cleft Palate/Craniofacial Syndromes, Deafness, Hearing Impairment, Autism, Apraxia, Dysarthria, and Head and Neck Cancer

Where do they work?

SLPs work in many different settings including schools, clinics, private practices, hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, rehabilitation centers, public health agencies, universities, state and federal government agencies, health departments, and research laboratories.

- HAS 311 Speech and Language Development
- HAS 312 Anatomy and Physiology of the Speech, Language and Hearing Mechanism
- HAS 313 Speech Science

COURSE NAME	COURSE DESCRIPTION	CREDITS
Speech and Language Development	This online course will provide students with knowledge about a child's speech and language development from birth through adolescence. Topics include theories of speech and language acquisition, neurological basis of speech and language development including the motor and perceptual basis, speech and language development during infancy, preschool, school-age and adolescence, speech and language sampling analysis, and the importance of cultural linguistic diversity and environmental influences on development. This course or the equivalent (in another program) is a required prerequisite course for admission into the graduate program in Speech-Language Pathology at Stony Brook University.	3
Speech Science	This online course will introduce students to acoustics, psychoacoustics, acoustical and articulatory properties of speech production, theories and models of speech perception and apply theoretical information with current technology and research in the field. Instrumentation used to measure respiratory, laryngeal, velopharyngeal and pharyngeal components will be discussed. Applied Phonetics of English or an equivalent course is a prerequisite for this course. This course or the equivalent (in another program) is a required prerequisite course for admission into the graduate program in Speech-Language Pathology at Stony Brook University.	3
Applied Phonetics of English	This online course will provide a foundation for studying the speech sounds used in the production of American English. There will be discussion about the branches of phonetics, classification of speech sounds, sound to symbol transcription using the International Phonetic Alphabet and second language	3

	and social/regional dialectical influences. This course or the equivalent (in another program) is a required prerequisite course for admission into the graduate program in Speech-Language Pathology at Stony Brook University.	
Anatomy and Physiology of the Speech, Language and Hearing Mechanism	This online course will provide the students with a basic understanding of the anatomy and physiology of the speech, language and hearing mechanism. Students will be able to apply their knowledge of anatomy and physiology of the speech and auditory mechanism to different disorders and diseases. This course or the equivalent (in another program) is a required prerequisite course for admission into the graduate program in Speech-Language Pathology at Stony Brook University.	3

Prerequisite Course Content Areas Related to SLP Certification Standards

All students are required to take courses in statistics as well as the biological, physical, and social/behavioral sciences (Standard IV-A) prior to admission into the Master's program in Speech-Language Pathology. The Council for Clinical Certification in Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology (CFCC) announced changes to the SLP certification standards, including a modification to Standard IV-A, in which the physical science requirement must be met by completing coursework in the areas of either chemistry or physics. This change pertains only to applicants who apply under the 2020 SLP standards.
